



BOOK REVIEW



My Salinger Year

by Joanna Rakoff





Joanna joined the firm in 1996. Though a very old and prestigious firm, they had not moved forward with the times. She found the place carpeted with lovely Orientals, dimly lit and old fashioned...no computers here to lighten the load; shared desk phones, Selectric typewriters and a floor-pedal Dictaphone greeted her at her new desk. The partners were of the mind that NOTHING should change with modern times, as Salinger liked things just the way they always had been. Salinger would call every couple of weeks to check up on his books, Dorothy and the Agency in general but basically just to chat. He was almost reclusive in his shyness and the telephone provided him the anonymity he demanded and needed.

It took Joanna nearly a year to get past being basically a secretary to Dorothy. She was finally allowed to read and edit some scripts, poems and small novels. During this time, she lived with her erratic, would-be- author boyfriend, Don. He was caustic, conceited and wildly jealous of any authors' successes (including Joanna's, after her book of poetry was published)...a relationship doomed from the beginning. Her passionate love affair during her college years with a bright, articulate and handsome man, now living in California and who never got over their breakup, was always just in the background...making this reviewer a bit impatient with her personal choices during the first half of the book.

My Salinger Year, is a great study of J.D. Salinger and his wonderful, unforgettable novels, his unusual personality and his fear of fame and the insecurities that this produced. It is also a book of New York City in the early pre-computer/digital age. This is a memoir of a young Joanna Rakoff's odyssey; her independent journey into the world of publishing and who early on, eagerly makes the trade off of a life of personal poverty (leaving her oven on with the doors open to heat her tiny apartment during the bitter cold winter) for the joyful experience of actually living and working in Manhattan in a job she loves. The reader will delight watching her make her way in a world not yet ready to allow her the independence she so fiercely sought. Joanna's story, her life, her off-beat friends and the working woman's world of the mid 90's, is fascinating and brings back stirring memories to those of us who ever had the good fortune of living and working in Manhattan.

This unpretentious jewel of a memoir made it impossible for this reviewer not to go immediately to the library and get a copy of J.D. Salinger's, *The Catcher In The Rye*...a book I first read in 1954 and have never quite forgotten. Who could ever forget Holden Caulfield...... ************

The Catcher In The Rye by J. D. Salinger



This story begins in a mental hospital where we find Holden Caulfield, J.D. Salinger's incredible sixteen year old anti-hero, recovering from a nervous breakdown. He is a man-child who fought growing up with all he possessed until it nearly drove him out of his mind. He constantly battles his grief for his brother Allie, who died three years earlier of leukemia, and his obsessively protective love for his little sister, Phoebe. Young and at war with society as he perceives it, he recognizes the phoniness of those around him, starting with his Pencey Prep school mates (yet another prep school from which he had recently been expelled), their professors and even within his own family. His fear of growing up makes him dream, he tells Phoebe, of being a "catcher in the rye", where he tries to catch children before they fall off of his perceived cliff of childhood. Adulthood, is just not something that Holden can handle, nor does he want to try... it is

This is J. D. Salinger's little story which grew and grew and has stayed in the hearts and minds of generations of fans.



Reader's Advisory Group meets every month on the second Thursday from 1:30-3:00 p.m. at the library. Please join us to "show and tell" a recently read book.

These are excerpts from the shared reviews.

Years Of Wonder, by Geraldine Brooks – Ms. Brooks set her novel in the village of Eyam, England in 1666 when the plague was rampant in Europe. Eyam closed or cordoned itself off to prevent the plague's spread. On August 13,2014, a story appeared in the New York Times, about the Ebola outbreak in Africa and made reference to the village of Eyam. The protagonist of Brooks' book, Anna Frith, watches as illness and death spread through her own home and throughout the village. At the village clergyman's urging, the villagers agree to cordon themselves off...with one exception, the Lord of the Manor. As the hardships of the cordon progress, frantic villagers frenzied with fear, seek to place

blame. Midwives and healers, who work with potions, become targeted. Throughout the grief and sorrow of this *annus horribilis*, emerges acts of heroism and love, making it also an *annus mirabilis*, "a year of wonders", as the plague subsides and Eyam is safe once again.

Plum Pudding Murder, by Joanne Fluke. This is a part of the series about Hannah and takes place in Lake Eden, Minnesota, where Hannah owns The Cookie Jar, a bakery. During Christmas, the owner of the Crazy Elf Christmas Tree lot is murdered. There were rumors that the owner of the lot "was cooking the books" and when he was found dead, many people fell under suspicion. Hannah and her boyfriends, the local sheriff and the dentist, work to solve the case. Meanwhile, Hannah continues to bake for her shop. There are recipes for cookies and desserts in this book. Unusual and fun.

Dewey: The Small Town Library Cat Who Touched The World, by Vicki Myron - In January of 1988, Vicki Myron, head librarian of the Spencer, Iowa Library, found a small cat in the drop box with the books. Ms. Myron's story of how an eight week old kitten, who's official name was "Dewey-Readmore-Books", grew to be the delight of every library patron, young or old at the Spencer Library. The story of Dewey will warm the hearts of all who read this book.

Big Little Lies, by Liane Moriarty - Sometimes the little lies are the most dangerous. This book tells the story of Madeline, Celeste and Jane. *Madeline* has to deal with living in the same town as her ex-husband and his young yoga-instructor wife. She is also dealing with her teenage daughter who has decided she would rather live with her father and be an "activist" like her stepmother. *Celeste* is a beautiful woman of privilege whose beauty and social status belie a dark secret that is beginning to unravel. Single mom, *Jane* has moved to the beach town to get away from her past. When all of their secrets intersect at Parents' Trivia Night at school, tragedy ensues. The story, told in flash backs and police interviews, keeps one wondering what will happen next. This novel is by the widely acclaimed author of *The Husband's Secret*.
