# BOOKMARK

Dear Friends,

I want to welcome back to Punta Gorda the many residents who have been away for the summer and fall as well as the snow birds who have arrived to spend the winter in our beautiful city on the water. This welcome gives me the opportunity to share news on the progress of the new Punta Gorda Charlotte Library as well as other news of note.

Recently four Friends Board Members, Hank Bauman, Treasurer, Lois Modrow, Vice President, Minerva King, Secretary and I were afforded the opportunity to walk through the new library currently under construction. Jenny Buccieri, Charlotte County Construction Project Manager, arranged for the walk through. The walls are up, the roof is on, the windows are in and the framing has been completed. The construction is on time and the new library is scheduled to open the summer of 2019.

As a reminder, the first public input meeting for the new library was held in January 2016. When the architect asked for people to list their priorities for the new building, there was an overwhelming request for the *Friends* to continue to have a bookstore and for it to be larger. The County and the architect listened to the community and we are getting a larger space for the *Friends* Bookstore. Part of the walk through was to allow us to see our space and share our needs for the design of the new bookstore. There is also going to be office space for the *Friends* where we will process donations and work on *Friends* business. The architect will provide us design drawings for both the bookstore and the office as well as the costs for each.

The *Friends* will be paying to furnish the Bookstore and office. All financial decisions will be made by the *Friends* Board of Directors. This is in addition to the \$50,000 the *Friends* donated to help pay for an enhanced exterior design of the new library. We will also be funding some of the new furnishings in the main part of the new library. The *Friends* are able to do this because of the support we have from the community, both businesses and residents. Our funding comes from memberships, business patrons, the Friends Literary Luncheon fundraiser and donations. We appreciate your support.

In the last issue of the BOOKMARK, we announced the 2019 Literary Luncheon featuring *NY Times* and International Bestselling Author, Paula McLain. Tickets went on sale to *Friends* members on October 11, 2018. We were thrilled with the response and it sold out immediately. Copperfish Books will be selling Paula's books at the luncheon. We know there are many people who want to meet Paula and have a book signed, so Copperfish is making arrangements for Paula to have an event at the store while she is in Punta Gorda. The details have not been worked out, but you can check their website or stop by Copperfish and ask. It will be announced in the paper and on social media.



The March 2009 issue of the BOOKMARK announced the first annual *Friends* Luncheon which was held on March 27, 2009 at Twin Isles Country Club. The featured guest was literary actress Barbara Rinella. Her presentation was based on Nora Ephron and her book *I Feel Bad About My Neck and Other Thoughts On Being a Woman*. The luncheon was a success and Barbara has graced us with three more presentations over the years.

Since 2009, our Literary Luncheon has become one of the most popular events in our community, so much so, that we had to move to the Isles Yacht Club which is a larger venue and has allowed us to more than double the number of guests that attended the event in 2009.

As I close out the year, I want to thank the *Friends* Board for their commitment to our mission of serving the library and our community. I am delighted the entire Board will be staying together in 2019 and together with you, we will celebrate the opening of the Punta Gorda Charlotte Library in 2019.

In closing, I want to wish everyone a good holiday season. My season's greetings to you and yours include Happy Hanukkah, Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

## Advice for Your Device

If you need help with your electronic device, contact the Punta Gorda Library. Help is offered in 30 minute sessions on Friday mornings and afternoons. The morning sessions are between 10:00-11:00 and the afternoon sessions are between 2:00pm - 3:00pm.

The following assistance is available during an Advice for Your Device session:

- Setting up your Cloud Library (eBooks) account
- Setting up your Hoopla account
- Setting up your Pronunciator account
- Setting up your Freegal account
- How to use the library catalog
- Setting up an email account



These sessions are intended for learning specific tasks that can be accomplished within a half-hour session. If they are unable to provide the technology assistance you need, they will work with you to research alternative services in the community.

## Libraries in the Ancient World

The ancient library of Alexandria, Egypt was one of the world's great collections of literature. Estimates of the holdings are that hundreds of thousands of papyrus scrolls comprised the collection. Almost all significant Greek works, along with volumes from North Africa, the Middle East, and South Asia, were housed in the library. Imagine the ancient Greek philosophies, comedies, and tragedies. Some are extant today, but others are lost. In ancient times, however, all reportedly were present in the Library of Alexandria.

The circumstances that led to the building of the Library are fascinating. When Alexander the Great set out from Greece to conquer as much of the known world as possible, the mission was not just conquest: it was also a mission of exploration and collection of knowledge. When Alexander died without an heir in 323 B.C., the empire was divided among his top generals, with Ptolemy taking over the rule in Egypt and founding a dynasty. This was the Hellenistic world, which saw a blending of Greek culture with other cultures. Hellenism, of course, is the reason why the Greek language was used in many places outside of Greece.

Ptolemy I Soter (savior) established the Temple of the Muses – the Museion – in the Mediterranean seaside city of Alexandria (named for his late commander). The temple complex housed the museum, gardens, a zoo, and the Library. Later, a branch library was built at the Temple of Serapis.

Acquiring volumes for the Library was a challenge. There are accounts of ships and visitors to the city having their written volumes seized and taken to the Library. There, the written works were copied by hand, the originals were placed in the Library, and the copies were given to the original owners of the items. A similar story is that the originals of ancient Greek dramatic trilogies by Aeschylus, Sophocles, and Euripides were borrowed from the Athenian state archive and that a deposit was paid by the Ptolemaic king. The volumes were copied, the originals were kept in Alexandria, and the copies were sent to Athens, with the Egyptian king forfeiting the deposit.

The library no longer exists, and accounts of its destruction vary. One story is that, during the Roman period, Julius Caesar was in Alexandria and threatened by Ptolemaic ships in the harbor. Caesar ordered that the ships be set afire, and the fire spread and destroyed much of the city, including the main Library.

Another story is that, once Rome had become Christian, Emperor Theodosius I gave the order to destroy pagan temples. This story centers around the Temple of Serapis and the destruction of the branch library. A third explanation is that, many centuries after Rome had fallen, it was the Muslim Caliph Omar who destroyed the Library.

No matter how the destruction happened, a noble effort of humanity collapsed. Cultural treasures that had been carefully gathered and placed in the library were lost forever. A lesson for moderns is to always, always have backup sources of information.




