



## Century: A People's History of Charlotte County Book

Launch by Director Judi Beaumont




On the afternoon of June 9, 2021, a number of Charlotte County residents gathered at the Punta Gorda Isles Civic Association to attend a book launch of <u>Century: A People's History of Charlotte County</u>, edited and published by James Abraham. Mr. Abraham describes the book as a labor of love to commemorate Charlotte County's 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.

The book is 267 pages that Mr. Abraham describes as a cafeteria-style read so one can learn about the history at one's own pace. It contains essays from other historians, community and elected leaders, a chronology by decade, and many full-color photographs, charts, maps

and graphs.

One of the essays in the book was written by *Friends* board member Tony Farina and contains an excellent recitation of the history and community commitment of what is now the *Friends* of the Punta Gorda Charlotte Library, Inc.

### Book Review by Director Tony Farina



The thing about good literature is that it captures the imagination of all the people who read it. There are some classics out there like, <u>The Little Prince</u>, <u>Anne of Green Gables</u> or <u>The Secret Garden</u>, that children love and that adults remember so fondly, they read them again and again, no matter what the age on their driver's license says. Writer and artist Brenna Thummler knows a thing or two about creating good literature that captures the hearts and minds of readers of all ages.

So, it makes sense that Brenna Thummler burst on the scene doing Andrews McMeel Publishing's graphic novel adaptation of <u>Anne of Green Gables</u> only to follow it up with Barnes and Noble's best book of 2018, her own creation <u>Sheets</u>. The follow up, ut in March of 2021 and it too, is destined to be a classic

While I don't want to spoil anything here, just know that when you sit down to read <u>Sheets</u> and <u>Delicates</u>, both available in the library and on Hoopla Digital, you should be prepared for a few things. First, you will not want to stop reading. Don't make any plans. Second, you will want to have some tissues handy. Finally, when you are done crying, you will want to start all over again so you can spend time with the beautiful art and colors all done by Thummler as well.

Thummler captures the middle school experience in such a beautiful way. She reminds us that growing up is tough and that even when kids are not alone, they feel alone. Adults often forget that what seems like a minor incident in the day for them, is actually a life-changing, earth-shattering moment in the life of a 6<sup>th</sup> grader.

Middle school is that time where we know what being grown up is supposed to mean, but we also know we just aren't there yet. We push away those who want to help all while desperately wanting them to stay no matter what we say. We make bad choices. We learn what consequences are. Everything that middle school is, was and will be comes out of the pages of Thummler's masterful books.

There is plenty of time between now and February before Brenna graces us with her presence by coming to talk to the  $6^{th}$  graders at the Punta Gorda Middle school. Start reading now so that maybe your eyes will be dry enough by the time she arrives.

It is with sadness that we report the passing of Bette Albarran. Bette chaired several successful *Friends* fundraisers over the years and was active in the community. The *Friends* board has donated two books to the library in her memory.

### Friends Bookstore Donations by Director Katie Mazzi

The Friends bookstore is open Monday through Saturday, 10:15 to 4 pm daily.

The bookstore sells donated fiction and non-fiction books that are new, nearly new and in good to excellent condition. We focus on books that we know our patrons are looking to purchase.

We have limited shelf space in the bookstore and very little storage space in the *Friends* office, so we have to be prudent in what we accept. Most hardback books older than 7 years don't sell nor do any books that are yellowed and falling apart. Books that have been stored in garages, basements or attics will have dust mites, mildew and insects. Those books as well as any that are wet, smelly and dirty cannot be accepted.

I want to encourage you to go ahead and start sorting through your books and donate to the *Friends* those new and nearly new books that others want to read.

The bookstore does not sell textbooks, medical books, business course books, trade manuals, encyclopedias, old reference books such as out of date dictionaries, service manuals and computer books more than 2 years old. We should not nor do we sell the Advanced Readers copies of books that publishers send out ahead of the official publication date, intended to generate positive reviews for the book. There are times these books will be edited and even changed prior to the final printing.

From time to time someone will come into the bookstore and want to give us a very large donation that represents the clearing out of a home. We cannot accept donations like this since so much of what has been accumulated over the years won't sell. It can be a difficult conversation to have with someone about this, but again, space is limited and having a knowledge of what sells helps us with these decisions. The key is to keep only those books you know you will and do read again. Otherwise, share them now while others are interested in reading them.

The *Friends* reserve the right to refuse any donation and we reserve the right to dispose of any donations that do not meet our acceptance guidelines or items that do not sell.

The Punta Gorda *Friends* of the Library can receive a small percentage of your purchases from Amazon through Amazon Smile. Participation in this program does not add anything to your bill; Amazon will just donate 0.5% of your purchases to the *Friends*.
