The Charlotte County Library system is preparing for a fun-filled summer reading program with the theme, Adventure Begins at the Library. The summer reading program kickoff will include family activities and reading challenges. During the summer reading kickoff, the *Friends* will once again provide those who sign up for the summer reading program a hot dog lunch from the "It's a Hot Dog Day" vendor.

The Youth Services department has also arranged for children's author, Alex Willan, to visit the library on Saturday, July 13th. Alex is the author and illustrator of Dragons are the Worst, Yetis are the Worst, Unicorns are the Worst and his most recent title, Leprechauns are the Worst in addition to other picture books. *Unicorns are the Worst* won third place in the Sunshine State Young Readers Junior Awards for 2021-2022. Alex will be available to sign books, lead a drawing activity as well as read one of his books to

the audience. The Friends are proud to sponsor Alex's visit.

The Punta Gorda Charlotte Library opened its doors on August 26, 2019. The new library replaced the old structure on West Henry Street that was built and opened in 1974. Although that building had been repaired after Hurricane Charley in 2004, there were still ongoing issues as well as being too small to meet the needs of the growing Punta Gorda community.

Since the doors opened at the current library in 2019, we have been through tropical storms that flooded downtown Punta Gorda, the pandemic that closed the library for a while, and Hurricane Ian which left our area devastated. Fortunately, the new well-built library survived the storm.

Yes, there was some water under the doors, and trees and lamp posts were knocked down, but electric power and internet service were quickly restored and the building was quickly opened to the public 7 days a week with extended hours. For people who had not been library users, they saw the benefit of having this kind of community space.

Hurricane Ian severely damaged Mid-County Library and it remains closed. Those of us who volunteer in the Friends Bookstore are often asked when Mid-County Library will open. All we can do is direct people to the Charlotte County Library website pages for the latest updates. Meanwhile, we welcome all the patrons who used to visit the Mid-County Library.

The bookstore has been busy all season and we appreciate both patrons making purchases as well making donations. I am so proud to work with all the bookstore

Thanks to a generous donation from the Shively Foundation, the Friends of the Punta Gorda Charlotte Library was able to expand our annual literacy outreach program to include not just Punta Gorda Middle School, but Charlotte High School as well.

Manga artist, Misako Rocks! shared with the 6th and 9th grades stories from her life in Japan and how she followed her dreams to write and draw graphic novels. The descendent of Samurai, it was expected that she,

like the rest of her family, would become a police officer. Instead, she let her love of creativity and art, bring her to America for a study abroad while in college. She fell in love with the country and, after she finished up her studies back in Japan, she came here permanently. While living in New York, during a visit to the public library she realized Americans loved manga as much as they do in Japan. Her tenacity and dogged determination landed her a book deal that has supported her for many years.



She broke up her talk about perseverance and the power of art and creativity with demonstrations of her actual artwork. The students erupted in applause each time. After each event, she did a one-hour workshop with 30 students in the schools' media centers where she taught the students how to design and create characters. She gave away the sample drawings as well as signed a book, generously donated by the *Friends* to each of the workshop students.

Misako also did an event at the library and at Copperfish Books. Students, teachers, and members of the communi-





ty were left inspired to tell their own stories and live their dreams. Once again, the friends lived their mission by supporting literacy and reminding students that the library is the place to go to be inspired and to become the person they want to be.

2024 Literary Luncheon

Kate Quinn is a renowned author for a good reason. She knows how to speak to her audience, deliver, and keep them enthralled. This is exactly what she did to a sold-out house at the 2024 Literary Luncheon sponsored by the Friends of the Library on February 21st.

Kate gave us a brief history of her background (who knew she had a master's degree in classical voice). She then discussed her latest book which was the first time she co-authored with Janie Chang. Two authors collaborated to write one book, *The Phoenix Crown*. They were equal partners. They each had their own main character but the trick was to blend them into a believable and entertaining story. Sometimes the two authors would disagree about the other's



character, explain to each other their reasoning, and then compromise and continue. Both authors became good friends and work colleagues.



The primary setting of their novel was San Francisco immediately after the devastating earthquake of 1906. We learned the "Chinatown" of today is the result of community planning with the primary motive of attracting tourists, not at all similar to its historical roots. Her character, Gemma, one of the two main women, is portrayed as an opera singer. Opera was near and dear to her heart, something she had been trained in and could speak knowledgeably about. It would seem harder than writing a book by yourself, but on the other hand, Kate found this book more productive with collaboration. She kept the entire audience's interest throughout.

How fortunate Punta Gorda is to have the organization "Friends of the Library" who bring such famous authors to our little town. Another reason our library is so fortunate is volunteers like Linda Bauman who again this year created, machine pieced, and donated a literary-themed quilt for the Luncheon's silent auction.

It was entitled "Best Sellers." Of course, Kate Quinn's *The Rose Code* was featured, along with other authors who graced our past Luncheons. Since 2009 Friends has brought 14 different authors to town; most recently



William Kent Krueger, Kristin Harmel, Marie Benedict, Paula McLain, Marie Benedict, and B.A. Shapiro. We in the Punta Gorda community are truly fortunate to be able to avail ourselves of this wonderful opportunity to enrich our literary experience. Thank you, Friends! Keep up your good work.
