From The Bookstore

The Friends Bookstore is operated by volunteers who enjoy being surrounded by books, talking about authors, and comparing notes with other readers. We welcome our regular patrons and are always happy when new people stop by to see who we are and what we do. Everyone is encouraged to browse even if they don't buy anything. Our hope is that they will return another time.

The bookstore revenue is a vital source of income for the Friends. It helps us meet our mission of advocating on behalf of the library, funding programs, and purchasing equipment, games, and furniture for the library. When our library opened in 2019, the Friends paid to furnish the children's and teen rooms as well as the bookstore. Over time, items have been added, upgraded, or replaced. The Maker Space room is an area where we have made major contributions for new and updated equipment.

The Friends also invest by subscribing to the excellent monthly publication *BookPage*. We offer it for free to library patrons in a print version or a digital version online through the Friends website. Over the years, we have increased the number of printed copies we order in our yearly subscription due to reader interest.

If you are not familiar with *BookPage* and are always looking for something new to read, you will like this publication. The copies are located inside the library on a table near the door. It introduces new authors as well as anticipated bestsellers across all genres, including historical fiction, literary fiction, popular fiction, mysteries and thrillers, nonfiction, biography & memoirs, romance, cozies, audiobooks, lifestyles, children, young adult, and more. There are book reviews with recommendations and author interviews.

Each month, I read the *BookPage* and make notes about books I want to read or find out more about featured authors. I follow up by going online to the [Charlotte County Library](#) page and checking to see if the books are available to put on hold. If a new book is not in the system, I will put a request in for the library to purchase the book. If you aren't sure how to navigate the Charlotte County Library website page, stop by the library and talk with one of the library employees. They are always glad to help.

We look forward to seeing you in the bookstore.

Literacy Outreach with Jarrett J. Krosoczka by Tony Farina, *Friends* Director





Jarrett J. Krosoczka (pronounced Crow-Sauce-Kah), known since boyhood as "JJK," is the New York Times bestselling author/illustrator behind more than forty books for young readers, including his wildly popular Lunch Lady graphic novels, select volumes of the Star Wars™: Jedi Academy series, and Hey, Kiddo, which was a National Book Award Finalist. Krosoczka creates books with humor, heart, and deep respect for his young readers—qualities that have made his titles perennial favorites on the bookshelves of homes, libraries, and bookstores over the past twenty years. He will be this year's literacy outreach speaker sponsored by the Friends of the Punta Gorda Charlotte Library and the Shively Charitable Foundation.

In addition to his work in print, Krosoczka produced, directed, and performed in the full-cast audiobook adaptations of his graphic novels. The Hey, Kiddo audiobook garnered both Audie and Odyssey Awards for excellence in audiobook production. The Lunch Lady audiobook, led by Kate Flannery (The Office), garnered an Odyssey Honor.

Krosoczka has been a guest on NPR's Fresh Air with Terry Gross, profiled in The New York Times, featured on Good Morning America, and delivered three captivating TED Talks that have accrued millions of online views. Krosoczka garners millions more views online monthly via the tutorials he produces for YouTube and TikTok. As well as working on his books' film and television adaptations, Krosoczka has also written for The Snoopy Show (Apple TV+) and served as a consultant for Creative Galaxy (Prime Video), and appeared in live segments for the show.

Realizing his books can inspire young readers beyond the page, Krosoczka founded School Lunch Hero Day, a national campaign celebrating school lunch staff. A consummate advocate for arts education, Krosoczka also established the Joseph and Shirley Krosoczka Memorial Youth Scholarships, which fund art classes for underprivileged children in his hometown of Worcester, Massachusetts.

Krosoczka lives in western Massachusetts with his spouse and their three children, a pug named Frank, and a French bulldog named Bella Carmella.

Pages From Our Library's Past by Katie Mazzi, *Friends* President & Bookstore Manager

When you drive to the Punta Gorda Charlotte Library one of the first things you notice is the thought provoking mural on the front of the building. This mural features a two page 'scrapbook' of images and newspaper clippings about the library dating back to its start in 1908.

When Charlotte County started designing the library on Shreve Street, the Punta Gorda Historic Mural Society reached out to county staff and asked for the opportunity to paint a mural on the new building that would celebrate the history of libraries in Punta Gorda. The Friends of the Punta Gorda Charlotte Library are proud to have been a sponsor of this mural.

Skip Dryda was commissioned to design and paint the mural. His vision included the backstory of the history of libraries in Punta Gorda which begins when the first library opened in April 1908 in the guild room at the rectory of the Episcopal Church. Over the years, the library expanded to meet the needs of the growing community, surviving multiple hurricanes, and moving five times to larger and larger facilities.

The Punta Gorda Historic Mural Society is a non-profit whose mission is to preserve the rich history of Punta Gorda through art and education. They are proud to be a part of the Florida Mural Trail.

The Mural Society is offering guided walking tours of the Punta Gorda murals through March.

The Punta Gorda Historic Mural Society also published the book *PAINTING THE TOWN, 30 Years of Murals, History and the Stories Discovered Along the Way*. It shares the 30-year history of the murals with photo and information about each mural and a summary of the local history it depicts, coupled with a few stories we have discovered along the way. The stories relate to the history and help to add a perspective to our past. It also contains lots of historic photos as well. It is available at Copperfish Books.






Literary Luncheon Keynote speaker, Therese Anne Fowler (pronounced ta-reece) is the third child and only daughter of a couple who raised their children in Milan, Illinois. An avowed tomboy as a child, Therese protested her grandmother's determined attempts to dress her in frills, and then, to further her point, insisted on playing baseball even though Milan had a perfectly good girls' softball league. She was one of the first girls in the U.S. to play Little League baseball.

After several publishing disappointments she decided to forge her own path, against the "professional advice she was getting" and she wrote the 2013 biographical historical novel about Zelda Fitzgerald, *Z*. It was a best seller and was adapted into an original dramatic series for Amazon Studios.

Therese discovered that she has an affinity for strong women from history whose stories have been either mistold or are largely untold. Her 2018 novel *A Well-Behaved Woman*, is a kind of homage to Edith Wharton with a dash of affection for Jane Austen for good measure. *A Good Neighborhood*, published in 2020, explores the effects of class, race, and heartrending star-crossed love. Her most recent novel, *It All Comes Down to This*, was released in 2022.

Therese has been a visiting professor at North Carolina State University, a member of Phi Beta Kappa and PEN America, she is married to award-winning professor and author John Kessel.
